Amendment No. 1 to Schedule 13D

This Amendment No. 1 to Schedule 13D amends and supplements the statements on the previously filed Schedule 13D, as amended, filed by Baker Bros. Advisors LP (the "Adviser"), Baker Bros. Advisors (GP) LLC (the "Adviser GP"), Julian C. Baker, Felix J. Baker (collectively the "Reporting Persons"). Except as supplemented herein, such statements, as heretofore amended and supplemented, remain in full force and effect. Information given in response to each item shall be deemed incorporated by reference in all other items, as applicable. Each capitalized term used but not defined herein has the meaning ascribed to such term in the Schedule 13D, as amended.

The Adviser GP is the sole general partner of the Adviser. Pursuant to management agreements, as amended, among the Adviser, Baker Brothers Life Sciences, L.P. ("Life Sciences") and 667, L.P. ("667", and together with Life Sciences, the "Funds"), and their respective general partners, the Funds' respective general partners relinquished to the Adviser all discretion and authority with respect to the investment and voting power of the securities held by the Funds, and thus the Adviser has complete and unlimited discretion and authority with respect to the Funds' investments and voting power over investments.

Item 3. Source and Amount of Funds or Other Consideration

The disclosure in Item 4 below is incorporated herein by reference.

Item 4. Purpose of the Transaction.

On January 28, 2019 Kiniksa Pharmaceuticals, Ltd. (the "Issuer") entered into an underwriting agreement (the "Underwriting Agreement") with J.P. Morgan Securities LLC, Goldman Sachs & Co. LLC and Barclays Capital Inc. (the "Underwriters"), related to a public offering (the "Offering") of 2,654,984 Class A common shares of the Issuer ("Class A common shares") at a price to the public of \$18.26 per share. In addition, the Issuer granted the Underwriters an option exercisable for 30 days from the date of the Underwriting Agreement to purchase, at the public offering price less any underwriting discounts and commissions, up to an additional 398,247 Class A common shares to cover overallotments, if any. Concurrently with the Offering, the Issuer on January 28, 2019 entered into a private placement agreement ("Private Placement") with the Funds for the purchase of 2,000,000 Class A1 common shares of the Issuer ("Class A1").

Pursuant to the Private Placement which closed on February 4, 2019, 667 and Life Sciences purchased 181,525 and 1,818,475 Class A1, respectively, at the offering price of \$18.26 per share, totaling \$36,520,000 for 2,000,000 Class A1 in the aggregate. Each of 667 and Life Sciences purchased the Class A1 with their working capital.

Felix J. Baker and Dr. Stephen R. Biggar each hold 18,760 options to purchase Class A common shares ("Stock Options") at an exercise price of \$18.00 which vest in equal monthly installments such that they will become fully vested on the first anniversary of the grant date and expire on May 23, 2028. The Stock Options were granted to Julian C. Baker and Dr. Biggar in connection with their service on the Issuer's Board of Directors (the "Board") under the Issuer's 2018 Incentive Award Plan. Julian C. Baker and Dr. Biggar each have 15,634 vested Stock Options.

Felix J. Baker, a managing member of the Adviser GP and Dr. Stephen R. Biggar, a full-time employee of the Adviser, have served on the Board since October 14, 2015. The policy of the Funds and the Adviser does not permit managing members of the Adviser GP or full-time employees of the Adviser to receive compensation for serving as directors of the Issuer, and the Funds are instead entitled to the pecuniary interest in any compensation received for their service. Felix J. Baker and Dr. Biggar have no voting or dispositive power and no pecuniary interest in the Stock Options. Other than through their control of the Adviser, Felix J. Baker and Julian C. Baker have neither voting nor dispositive power and have no direct pecuniary interest in the Stock Options held by Felix J. Baker and Dr. Biggar.

The Funds hold securities of the Issuer for investment purposes. The Reporting Persons or their affiliates may purchase additional securities or dispose of securities in varying amounts and at varying times depending upon the Reporting Persons' continuing assessments of pertinent factors, including the availability of Class A common shares or other securities for purchase at particular price levels, the business prospects of the Issuer, other business investment opportunities, economic conditions, stock market conditions, money market conditions, the attitudes and actions of the Board and management of the Issuer, the availability and nature of opportunities to dispose of securities of the Issuer and other plans and requirements of the particular entities. The Reporting Persons may discuss items of mutual interest with the Issuer, which could include items in subparagraphs (a) through (j) of Schedule 13D.

Depending upon their assessments of the above factors, the Reporting Persons or their affiliates may change their present intentions as stated above and they may assess whether to make suggestions to the management of the Issuer regarding financing, and whether to acquire additional securities of the Issuer (by means of open market purchases, privately negotiated purchases, exercise some of all of the Stock Options, or otherwise) or to dispose of some or all of the securities of the Issuer under their control.

Except as otherwise disclosed herein, at the present time, the Reporting Persons do not have any plans or proposals with respect to any extraordinary corporate transaction involving the Issuer including, without limitation, those matters described in subparagraphs (a) through (j) of Item 4 of Schedule 13D.

ITEM 5. Interest in Securities of the Issuer.

(a) and (b) Items 7 through 11 and 13 of each of the cover pages of this Amendment No. 1 are incorporated herein by reference.

The information set forth in Item 4 is hereby incorporated by reference into this Item 5.

The Class A1 are non-voting and convert at any time at the election of the holder without consideration to Class A common shares subject to limitations on conversion as described below. The Class A1 are only convertible to the extent that immediately prior to or after giving effect to such conversion the holders thereof and their affiliates would not beneficially own, for purposes of Rule 13d-3 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended (the "Exchange Act"), in excess of 4.99% of the outstanding Class A common shares or any other class of equity security that is registered pursuant to Section 12 of the Exchange Act. As a result of this restriction, the number of Class A common shares that may be issued on conversion of the Class A1 by the holders may change depending upon changes in the number of outstanding Class A common shares. A holder of Class A1 may increase, decrease or waive this limitation on beneficial ownership by providing the Issuer with 61-days' notice. The Class A1 have no expiration date. Each Class A1 automatically converts into one Class A common share upon transfer, except for transfers to or between affiliated holders.

The Class B1 are non-voting and convert at any time at the election of the holder to either Class B common shares of the Issuer (“Class B common shares”) or Class A common shares, subject to limitations on conversion as described below. The Class B1 are only convertible to the extent that immediately prior to or after giving effect to such conversion the holders thereof and their affiliates would not beneficially own, for purposes of Rule 13d-3 under the Exchange Act, in excess of 4.99% of the outstanding Class A common shares or any other class of equity security that is registered pursuant to Section 12 of the Exchange Act. As a result of this restriction, the number of Class A common shares that may be issued on conversion of the Class B1 by the holders may change depending upon changes in the outstanding number of Class A common shares. A holder of Class B1 may increase, decrease or waive this limitation on ownership by providing the Issuer with 61-days' notice. The Class B1 have no expiration date. The Class B common shares have 10 votes per share while the Class A common shares have 1 vote per share. Each Class B common share is convertible at any time at the election of the holder into one Class A common share. Each Class B1 automatically converts into one Class A common share upon transfer, except for transfers to or between affiliated holders.

Without any limitation on conversion of the Class A1 and Class B1, the Reporting Persons may be deemed beneficial owners of a combined total of 28,842,278 Class A common shares, representing approximately 64.5% of total outstanding Class A common shares assuming that only the Reporting Persons convert (including Class A common shares issuable upon conversion of the Class A1 and Class B1 held by the Funds).

The Adviser GP, Felix J. Baker and Julian C. Baker as principals of the Adviser GP, and the Adviser may be deemed to be beneficial owners of securities of the Issuer directly held by the Funds, and may be deemed to have the power to vote or direct the vote of and the power to dispose or direct the disposition of such securities.

The Reporting Persons disclaim beneficial ownership of the securities held by each of the Funds, and this Amendment No. 1 shall not be deemed an admission that the Reporting Persons are the beneficial owners of such securities for purposes of Section 13(d) or for any other purpose, except to the extent that any such Reporting Persons actually exercises voting or dispositive power with respect to such securities.

(c) The information set forth in Item 4 is hereby incorporated by reference into this Item 5(c). Except as disclosed herein, none of the Reporting Persons or their affiliates has effected any other transactions in securities of the Issuer during the past 60 days.

(d) Certain securities of the Issuer are held directly by 667, a limited partnership the sole general partner of which is Baker Biotech Capital, L.P., a limited partnership the sole general partner of which is Baker Biotech Capital (GP), LLC. Julian C. Baker and Felix J. Baker are the controlling members of Baker Biotech Capital (GP), LLC.

Certain securities of the Issuer are held directly by Life Sciences, a limited partnership the sole general partner of which is Baker Brothers Life Sciences Capital, L.P., a limited partnership the sole general partner of which is Baker Brothers Life Sciences Capital (GP), LLC. Julian C. Baker and Felix J. Baker are the controlling members of Baker Brothers Life Sciences Capital (GP), LLC.

SUBSCRIPTION AGREEMENT

This subscription agreement (this “**Subscription Agreement**”) is made as of January 28, 2019, by and among the Investors identified on the signature pages hereto (“**Investors**”), and Kiniksa Pharmaceuticals, Ltd., a Bermuda exempted company (the “**Company**”), and the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. Subscription.

(a) The Company has authorized the sale and issuance to the Investors (the “**Offering**”) of up to 2,000,000 of the Company’s Class A1 common shares, par value \$0.000273235 per share, at a price per share equal to the public offering price (the “**Subscription Price**”) in the concurrent public offering (the “**Public Offering**”) of the Company’s Class A common shares, par value \$0.000273235 per share, pursuant to a registration statement on Form S-1 (the “**Registration Statement**”). The amount to be paid by each Investor to the Company for such Investor’s Shares shall be equal to the number of Shares set forth opposite such Investor’s name on Schedule A attached hereto multiplied by the Subscription Price.

(b) Assuming the accuracy of the Investors’ representations and warranties set forth in Section 4, no registration under the Securities Act of 1933, as amended (the “**Securities Act**”), is required for the offer and sale of the Shares by the Company to the Investors as contemplated hereby.

(c) At the Closing (as defined in Section 2(a) below), the Company and the Investors agree that the Investors will purchase from the Company and the Company will issue and sell to the Investors, upon the terms and conditions set forth herein, the Shares in exchange for the aggregate Subscription Price. The Investors acknowledge that the Offering is not being underwritten and that there is no minimum offering amount.

(d) This Subscription Agreement will involve no obligation or commitment of any kind until this Subscription Agreement is accepted and countersigned by or on behalf of the Company.

2. Closing and Delivery of the Shares and Funds.

(a) The completion of the purchase and sale of the Shares (the “**Closing**”) shall take place at the offices of Latham & Watkins LLP (“**Latham**”), 885 Third Avenue, New York, NY 10028 (or such other location as the parties shall mutually agree) at substantially the same time as the closing of the Public Offering or at such other time and location as the Company and the Investors shall agree.

(b) At the Closing: (a) the Company shall cause the Company’s transfer agent to register in book-entry form the Shares, in the name of the Investors and (b) the Investors shall cause the aggregate Subscription Price for the Shares to be delivered to the Company by wire transfer of United States dollars in immediately available funds to an account specified by the Company.

(c) The Company's obligation to issue and sell the Shares to the Investors and the Investors' obligation to purchase the Shares from the Company shall be subject to (i) the Registration Statement being declared effective by the Securities and Exchange Commission and (ii) the satisfaction of the conditions set forth in Section 8 of the underwriting agreement for the Public Offering to be entered into by the Company and the representatives of the several underwriters of the Public Offering.

3. Representations, Warranties and Covenants of the Company. The Company acknowledges, represents and warrants to, and agrees with, the Investors that:

(a) The Company has the requisite right, power and authority to enter into this Subscription Agreement, to authorize, issue and sell the Shares as contemplated by this Subscription Agreement and to perform and to discharge its obligations hereunder; and this Subscription Agreement has been duly authorized, executed and delivered by the Company.

(b) The Shares to be issued and sold by the Company to the Investors under this Subscription Agreement have been duly authorized and the Shares, when issued and delivered against payment therefor as provided in this Subscription Agreement, will be validly issued, fully paid and non-assessable and free of any preemptive or similar rights.

(c) The execution and delivery of this Subscription Agreement and the consummation of the transactions contemplated hereby will not: (i) result in a breach or violation of any of the terms and provisions of, or constitute a default under, any law, rule or regulation to which the Company or any subsidiary is subject, or by which any property or asset of the Company or any subsidiary is bound or affected, (ii) conflict with, result in any violation or breach of, or constitute a default (or an event that with notice or lapse of time or both would become a default) under, or give to others any right of termination, amendment, acceleration or cancellation (with or without notice, lapse of time or both) of, any agreement, lease, credit facility, debt, note, bond, mortgage, indenture or other instrument or obligation or other understanding to which the Company or any subsidiary is a party or by which any property or asset of the Company or any subsidiary is bound or affected, or (iii) result in a breach or violation of any of the terms and provisions of, or constitute a default under, the Company's Memorandum of Association and Amended and Restated Bye-Laws, except in the case of clauses (i) and (ii) such breaches, violations, defaults, or conflicts which are not, individually or in the aggregate, reasonably likely to result in a material adverse effect upon the business, properties, operations, condition (financial or otherwise) or results of operations of the Company and its subsidiaries, taken as a whole, or in its ability to perform its obligations under the Subscription Agreement.

4. Representations, Warranties and Covenants of the Investors. Each Investor acknowledges, represents and warrants to, and agrees with, the Company that:

(a) The Investor has full right, power, authority and capacity to enter into this Subscription Agreement and to consummate the transactions contemplated hereby and has taken all necessary action to authorize the execution, delivery and performance of this Subscription Agreement.

(b) The Investor acknowledges its understanding and agreement that the Shares are being offered in a transaction not involving any public offering within the United States within the meaning of the Securities Act, or in a distribution in violation of the Securities Act or any jurisdiction, that the Shares have not been registered under the Securities Act or the securities laws of any jurisdiction and, unless so registered, may not be sold except as exempt from registration under the Securities Act.

(c) The Investor acknowledges its understanding that the Offering and sale of the Shares is intended to be exempt from registration under the Securities Act, by virtue of Section 4(a)(2) of the Securities Act and that the Company is relying on the Investor's representations and warranties in connection with this exemption. SUCH SHARES MAY NOT BE SOLD, PLEDGED, OR TRANSFERRED IN THE ABSENCE OF SUCH REGISTRATION OR A VALID EXEMPTION FROM THE REGISTRATION AND PROSPECTUS DELIVERY REQUIREMENTS OF SAID ACT.
